
How many events do you attend at the Alliant Energy Center (AEC) per year?




Opinions

Rarely attend any events there.





Of course a place for the cows in the dairy Expo is important toO



As I live in an adjacent neighborhood, I am worried that my neighborhood could become even more congested during events. Better public transportation might prevent more stress on our neighborhood.

ALL of these improvements would be welcome at AEC - very hard to just prioritize one over the others.

Increasing walkability should include bikeability with more place to park bikes. The nearby neighborhoods would not support any increase in outdoor noise as we already have much more of that than we did when we moved here 25 years ago. So what kinds of activities would not include outdoor noise? and draw people in? Public market, small concerts, park, play areas, walks on the grounds, quality ice cream, coffee shops...

The parking fees are ridiculous. I avoid almost anything there just for that.

One more response is needed. None of the above.

I would have selected multiple options. Walkable district, to me, means "restaurants & retail stores" in a mixed use environment, possibly including clubs or bars.

By transit I mean the ability to drive there. The funneling of everyone through a single gate creates ridiculous traffic jams. Give us Road access. Forget about walkability and forget about public transit. If you want out of town visitors coming here to support tax revenue, if you want people from outside the city of Madison, give us roads to get there. Forget all this other stuff that you're wasting money on.
